


Directions to the UDC Student Center 4200 Connecticut Ave NW, Washington, DC 20008

Directions from the Van Ness - UDC Metro Stop

The UDC Student Center is steps away from the Van Ness - UDC Metro Stop on the Red Line. Exit the station on the left/west side (toward UDC). When you reach the street level, make a sharp right and you will see the UDC Student Center. Walk across Veazey Terrace to reach the main entrance of the Student Center.

Directions from Van Ness Parking Garage

- Enter the parking garage from Van Ness Street.
- Park on Level B.
- Take the elevator nearest the driveway entrance to the garage (to the left as you face the driveway entrance)
 - Look for the door marked “Stairwell 2 / Building #44.”
- Take the elevator to floor A.
- Go straight out of the elevator through the double doors to the outside.
- Bear a slight left towards the glass columns.
- Go toward the Administration Building (#39).
- Walk under a pedestrian overpass toward the tall “Information” kiosk.
- Past the Information kiosk, make a right through the doors marked “Student Center.”
- Keep walking until you see the elevators on your left.
- Take the elevator to the lobby on Level B.

0 – 30 min = free


30 min – 1 hour = \$5

1 – 3 hours = \$8


3 – 6 hours = \$12

6 – 24 hours = %20


There are metered parking spaces on Connecticut Ave and Van Ness Street, as well as commercial parking garages on Connecticut Avenue.
